Each year, JAEI inducts three laureates and one entrepreneur who exemplify the following qualities:

- Integrity Ethical leadership and business practices.
- Community Commitment Dedication to improving Eastern Iowa.
- Leadership Serving as exemplary role models.
- Entrepreneurial Spirit Founding, growing, or significantly advancing a business with substantial community impact.

Nominees must have lived and worked in Eastern Iowa (Benton, Black Hawk, Bremer, Buchanan, Delaware, Grundy, Iowa, Johnson, Jones, Linn counties) and meet the outlined qualifications. Husband-and-wife teams will be considered only if they are equal business partners.
